

ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY

Sabre Holdings Limited is committed to the design and manufacture of products that satisfy all the statutory and customer environmental requirements as applicable to the markets into which they supply.

In order to meet this objective the organisation has developed and implemented an Environmental Management System (EMS) that provides the necessary controls and guidance needed and that will meet or exceed the requirements of the international standard ISO 14001.

The EMS will be subject to regular review and improvement where necessary, to ensure that it continues to satisfy the strategic direction of the organisation and the needs of all interested parties. All personnel are expected to work in accordance with the requirements of the EMS.

Top management will invest their time and effort in communicating the requirements of the EMS to the workforce, ensuring that they understand the company's strategy and their contribution towards achieving published environmental objectives. Objectives and Targets will be documented and associated action plans will assign responsibilities, resources and timescales as appropriate.


The Company's overriding intention will be to protect the environment and prevent pollution that could contaminate Land, Air or Water. This will be achieved by adhering to the EMS processes and procedures, eliminating or minimising the use of harmful substances wherever possible and preventing any accidental release.

The EMS will include processes and procedures for the identification of legal and other obligations, how compliance is achieved, the identification of environmental aspects and the assessment of their significance. The management of waste, including segregation and recycling will be a key aspect of the EMS, as will the minimising of energy use.

Where there is a need to train and develop personnel, so that they can work in accordance with the EMS, it is the responsibility of line management to identify and satisfy those needs.

Due consideration will be given to our business activities and whether they have any adverse environmental impact on our neighbours and/or the wider local community. We will also consider the life cycle of our products, from creating the materials of construction, through the supply chain into our assembly, to the final removal from service by the operator and the recyclability of the component parts.
